But he was kind, and loving and let his sister do all the talking and he liked that just fine. That was good enough for him.

One day as the two of them were walking to school they met a bunch of hooligans (for lack of a better term) a group of older, meaner kids who were looking for trouble and the found these two right in their line of fire. They went after the brother first for he looked to be a bit shy. But our Star Child sister would have none of that. She stood right up to those kids, her hair shining and yelled "Keep your hands off my brother!"

The brother's life is varied too. In one story he is proud of his sister, but embarrassed he did not stand up with her. In another, he is proud of her and supports her entirely. In another he lets the violence against them spark rage in himself and he becomes an aggressor. In another, he rises above it and fights for peace and children's rights.

There are so many possible outcomes, so many storylines here. Who the children are, how they behave, how they see the world, how the world sees them, how each event can shape us one way or another if we allow it to all create different endings to our Star Children story. All of these are

enmeshed in these possible storylines They are simply possibilities. All of these are enmeshed in your storyline.

The truth is that no matter what happened that day or what scenario took place, both children had choices in how to deal with it then and how to deal with it now. In a million moments after that day these children with such different personalities face choices on how this one event would shape the story of their lives.

In one current reality the brother is a senator fighting for gun control and school protection. In another he is dead from a drug overdose. It is the same with Star Child. In one she is a successful movie star, in another she is living on the streets.

Things happen in life. Challenges arise. Violence, aggression, crisis and bad things happen. Period. Who we are, how we relate to what happened and how we choose to let it define us is up to us. Even children as young as our Star Children have choices. They look to their parents, society, teachers, leaders, you and me to show them how to behave, how to process, how to cope. They look to others to reflect to them the world. What would make that child a leader? What would make him an aggressor? How best is it to mirror the best to them? How best is it to help them knowing that all have personal choices, even children? If we are fearful, the children are fearful. If we are calm, the children are calm. If we are able to face the trials of life with hope and dignity, it gives the children an example of what life can be. We can be the mentor, the sounding board, the mirror, the lighthouse to the children of the world simply by offering possibilities. These ideas, validation, and love we can bring hope, answers, and new possibilities to the children of the world.

They all have their own personalities. They all have their own viewpoint. They all make their own choices. But with more possibilities come more options to choose, giving a new vision of what life can be. Sometimes simply by being ourselves we can open even the smallest among us to the greatest of opportunities and possibilities.

We will always face challenges. We will always face trials. There will always be aggressors and those to be aggressive on. But what happens afterwards? What happens before? What is healed or opened or possible because of or in spite of is more complicated than just a group of bad guys and good kids.
